MATCH REPORT Glengormley PC vs Ballyhenry PC Monday 2nd May 2016

With a large crowd of supporters in attendance the squad assembled on a blustery Bank Holiday afternoon and after the skipper lost

the toss we start playing into a stiff wind but mainly dry conditions. The crowd munched on their sandwiches, shared various left over birthday cake and wondered at some amazement at the diversity of the footballing talent before them and graciously sympathised with the players who limped off with twisted knees, sprained ankles, hernias, slipped disks, exhaustion and the early stages of cardiac arrest. They were anxiously wondering of their squad of 17 players would be enough to see us to the end of the game while secretly many of our younger people hoped that the depletion of our team would lead to their unexpected call up. The first half did not go to plan with the Ballyhenry side making use of the conditions and applying some early pressure to the Glengormley defence, fifteen minutes in and Matthew Horner gave away a hotly disputed and quite frankly mysterious penalty, sadly for Matthew the only dispute was as to whether it was for a push in the back of the opposing forward or for the subsequent handball afterwards. The Ballyhenry forward dispatched the spot kick with ease despite the best efforts of 'The Cat' in the Glengormley Goal. Glengormley responded and applied some decent pressure on the Ballyhenry goal but failed to really test their keeper. The first half ended on a sour note for the Glengormley side when a mix up in the Glengormley defence led to the second Ballyhenry Goal. Changes had to be made. In what proved to be a master stroke at half time the legend of Tommy Smyth graced the pitch after a few years absence from the game and with a renewed determination the Glengormley side fought back with what can only be described as a wonder strike from young Smyth - how he was able to get such distance and accuracy with his shin is beyond me. With the score now 2-1 to Ballyhenry, the Glengormley side continued to make changes and apply further pressure onto the Ballyhenry goal and after some good work from Paul Fawcett and Johnny Duff in the centre of the park Andy McClelland was able to send in a scorcher to draw the sides level. This left the teams deadlocked entering the final fifteen minutes of the game. It was at this stage that Nathaniel McQueen (who came on as goal keeper at half time) proved to be a rock in the Glengormley Defence. After a break away by the Ballyhenry forward and despite the best efforts of Andy McClelland and Johnny Reaney whose "last ditch" sliding tackle was only a micro second late found a penalty awarded against him. Was all lost? It appeared so. However up steps our towering international goal keeper from Texas and – diving low to his left heroically saves the day. The final few minutes of the game proved to be a scrappy affair with tired limbs and a few hard challenges going in. And with the clock ticking over into Stoppage time the ref (who had done a fabulous job all day) blew the whistle to bring to an end a hotly contested but ultimately friendly game of football between two well matched teams. Final score 2-2. A number of thanks have to go to the following:- Dave Johnston for providing the sound and speakers, Anthony Gibson and Browns coffee shop for the gazebo to shelter under - which thankfully we didn't need. Peter Shepherd for jointly organising the event with Ballyhenry PC, all the GPC folk for turning up and making the day a very happy and enjoyable one. We will let you know how much was raised for TearFund when all the money is counted.
