
As in previous years you can help in a number of ways:-

Prayer Diary

Greetings from Edgar and Sandra McKinney at the Garden Tomb, Jerusalem.

We believe God has guided us to serve him as volunteers in this new area of Christian Service. The support we have received from you, is so reassuring as we have taken this step of faith. Yes, there have been some serious security incidents, one in particular close by. However, we have been conscious of God's protection throughout. Thank you for your prayers! On our arrival at Ben Gurion airport we were met by Stephen Bridge, the Director, who drove us to Jerusalem. Our excitement was quickly dispelled when we found out about the early start to the day. We thought it was 8.00: no the day starts at 6.00 - which is really 4.00 Glengormley time! After induction and training, we were thrown straight into our roles. Sandra is working in the shop and coping with three different currencies it was a really steep learning curve. She is meeting the spiritually touched people as they go to the shop to consider what they could possibly buy to ensure these moments spent with the risen Saviour will be treasured when they return home. Edgar guided his first tour group, but it was not the small group that had been expected. On finishing this first tour, another group was already waiting. Each group has a guided tour of the Garden, starting at Skull Hill and ending at the empty tomb. For many the climax is the celebration of the risen Saviour at Communion. There are twelve sites where communion can be held. Some are for small groups of 12, right through to very large groups of 400+. Next morning there was a group of 280 very enthusiastic Korean Christians. Wow they certainly know how to worship! There have been some thrilling experiences. For example, Edgar had two groups of about forty people in each. They were from UTAH: yes, they were all Mormons! Where else would you get the chance to present the challenge of the Gospel to such a large group of Mormons? Last Monday a group of 45 tourists arrived. They were from various traditions. Some with a sincere faith in Christ, but the majority simply tourists. Edgar had the chance to present the Gospel in an uncompromising way. As they moved to the final stage of the tour, one person approached Edgar and said it was great. "We really needed a good dose of Jesus." One highlight was to worship in a Palestinian Christian Church. So different from what we had experienced before. The meal afterwards was magnificent: typical of Palestinian hospitality. We enjoy rich fellowship with our covolunteers from Taiwan to South Africa, from Paraguay to Bethlehem, from USA to Glengormley, has been an education in spirituality to us. We feel humbled by their spirituality. Huge numbers come each day, for example from, Indonesia, Korea, Japan, China, Brazil, US, etc Our love for Jerusalem, especially the Garden Tomb, is undiminished, and for that, we praise God! We have been humbled by your love and prayers for us. We can reflect on some of the wonderful things God is doing here in the Garden Tomb and how he has chosen to do some of these things through us.
